WHAT THE CHURCH IS AND WHAT IT IS NOT

For Church Ministers

INTRODUCTION

Many ministers serve faithfully yet struggle with a clear, biblical understanding of what the Church truly is. Misunderstanding the nature of the Church leads to misplaced priorities, burnout, unhealthy leadership models, and ineffective ministry.

This self-study lesson is designed to ground ministers in Scripture, correct common misconceptions, and realign ministry with God's original intention for His Church.

Key Scripture:

"And I also say to you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it." — Matthew 16:18

PART 1: WHAT THE CHURCH IS

1. THE CHURCH IS THE BODY OF CHRIST

Scripture:

"Now you are the body of Christ, and members individually." — 1 Corinthians 12:27 (NKJV)

The Church is not an organization—it is a living organism. Christ is the Head, and every believer is a functioning member.

Key Truths:

- Every believer has a role
- No member is insignificant
- Growth depends on every part working properly

Illustration:

A human body cannot function if only the head is active. In the same way, a church where only the pastor functions is unhealthy and unbiblical.

Reflection Questions:

- Am I equipping members to function or making them dependent on me?
 - Is my church operating as a body or as a stage-centred gathering?

2. THE CHURCH IS A SPIRITUAL FAMILY

Scripture:

"Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God."
— Ephesians 2:19 (NKJV)

The Church is God's family—not a crowd of strangers.

Key Truths:

- Relationships matter more than programs
- Love is the defining mark of the Church
- Spiritual growth happens in community

Illustration:

A family does not gather once a week for a performance. They live life together, support each other, and grow together.

Reflection Questions:

- Does my church feel like a family or an event?
 - Are members known, cared for, and connected?

3. THE CHURCH IS THE TEMPLE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Scripture:

"Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" — 1 Corinthians 3:16 (NKJV)

God does not dwell in buildings—He dwells in people.

Key Truths:

- The presence of God defines the Church
- Holiness is essential
- Worship is a lifestyle, not just a service

Illustration:

A beautiful building without God's presence is just a hall. But even a simple gathering with God's presence becomes a true church.

Reflection Questions:

- Is the presence of God central in our gatherings?
 - Are we prioritizing spiritual depth over outward appearance?

4. THE CHURCH IS A MISSIONAL COMMUNITY

Scripture:

"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations..." — Matthew 28:19 (NKJV)

The Church exists for a purpose: to make disciples.

Key Truths:

- The Church is sent, not seated
- Evangelism and discipleship are central
- Growth is measured in transformed lives

Illustration:

A church that only gathers but never goes out is like a hospital that admits no patients.

Reflection Questions:

- Are we actively making disciples or just holding services?
 - Is outreach a priority or an afterthought?

PART 2: WHAT THE CHURCH IS NOT

1. THE CHURCH IS NOT ABOUT THE PASTOR

Scripture:

"For we do not preach ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord, and ourselves your bondservants for Jesus' sake." — 2 Corinthians 4:5 (NKJV)

The Church does not belong to the pastor—it belongs to Christ.

Key Truths:

- The pastor is a servant, not the centre
- Ministry should not revolve around one personality
- The goal is to raise others, not build personal influence

Warning Signs:

- Everything depends on the pastor
- Members cannot function without the pastor

- The church identity is tied to a personality

Illustration:

If a church collapses when a pastor is absent, it was built on a man, not Christ.

Reflection Questions:

- Have I made myself central in the church?
 - Am I raising leaders or controlling everything?

2. THE CHURCH IS NOT A BUSINESS ENTERPRISE

Scripture:

"You cannot serve God and mammon." — Matthew 6:24 (NKJV)

While administration and finances are necessary, the Church must never be driven by profit or business models.

Key Truths:

- The Church is not profit-driven
- People are not customers
- Ministry is not a product

Warning Signs:

- Decisions driven by money instead of God's leading
- Members treated like clients
- Emphasis on revenue over spiritual growth

Illustration:

A business measures success by profit. The Church measures success by transformed lives.

Reflection Questions:

- Are financial concerns controlling ministry decisions?
 - Do we prioritize giving over discipleship?

3. THE CHURCH IS NOT A BUILDING

Scripture:

"However, the Most High does not dwell in temples made with hands..." — Acts 7:48 (NKJV)

The building is only a meeting place—not the Church itself.

Key Truths:

- The Church exists beyond walls
- Ministry happens daily, not just on Sunday
- The Church moves wherever believers go

Illustration:

If the building is removed, the Church should still thrive.

Reflection Questions:

- Are we overly focused on facilities?
 - Can our church function outside Sunday gatherings?

4. THE CHURCH IS NOT A SOCIAL CLUB

Scripture:

"Having a form of godliness but denying its power." — 2 Timothy 3:5 (NKJV)

The Church is not merely a place for social interaction—it is a place of transformation.

Key Truths:

- Fellowship must be spiritual, not just social
- Power of God must be evident
- Lives must change

Illustration:

A social club entertains; the Church transforms.

Reflection Questions:

- Are people being changed or just entertained?
 - Is there evidence of spiritual growth?

PART 3: PRACTICAL APPLICATION FOR MINISTERS

1. REFOCUS YOUR MINISTRY

- Shift from performance to discipleship
- Emphasize spiritual growth over numbers
- Build people, not platforms

2. DEVELOP PEOPLE

- Train and release leaders
- Encourage participation
- Create opportunities for members to serve

3. PRIORITIZE GOD'S PRESENCE

- Deepen prayer life
- Cultivate true worship
- Teach holiness and obedience

4. STRENGTHEN COMMUNITY

- Build genuine relationships

- Encourage small groups or fellowships
 - Care for members personally

Take time to honestly evaluate your ministry:

1. What currently defines my church?
 2. Is Christ truly the centre?
 3. Are people growing spiritually?
 4. Am I building a system or a living body?
 5. What needs to change immediately?
