### **THE GREAT FLOOD**

#### **Seven-Day Sunday School Lesson for Kids**

**God's Grace Sanctuary**

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#### **INTRODUCTION**

The story of the Great Flood teaches children about obedience, faith, God's justice, and His mercy. Noah trusted God even when others did not understand him. Through this lesson series, children will learn that God always keeps His promises and cares for those who obey Him.

These lessons are designed for Sunday school children and include Bible stories, memory verses, activities, prayers, and discussions to help children grow in faith.

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#### **THE STORY OF NOAH AND THE GREAT FLOOD**

Long ago, the world became filled with wickedness. People were doing bad things every day and did not care about obeying God. This made God very sad. But among all the people on earth, there was one man who loved God very much. His name was Noah.

Noah was kind, honest, and obedient. He taught his children to love God too. Every day, Noah prayed and walked with God. While other people laughed at God's ways, Noah chose to do what was right.

One day, God spoke to Noah.

"Noah," God said, "the earth is full of evil. I am going to send a great flood. Build a large ark because I will save you and your family."

An ark was a huge boat made of wood. God gave Noah special instructions about how to build it. Noah listened carefully and obeyed.

Imagine Noah cutting huge pieces of wood under the hot sun. Day after day, he worked faithfully. Hammer! Hammer! Hammer! went the tools as Noah built the ark.

Some people laughed at him.

“Why are you building such a big boat?” they asked.

“There is no rain!” others mocked.

But Noah continued working because he trusted God.

## **Illustration**

Think about carrying an umbrella on a sunny day because your mother told you it would rain later. Even if the sky looks clear, you trust her words. Noah trusted God the same way.

After the ark was finished, God told Noah to bring animals into it. Two by two the animals came.

Big elephants stomped slowly into the ark. Tiny rabbits hopped inside. Tall giraffes bent their long necks. Lions roared loudly. Birds fluttered through the air.

Noah, his wife, his sons, and their wives entered the ark too.

Then God shut the door.

Soon dark clouds filled the sky. Rain began to fall. It rained for forty days and forty nights.

Splash! Splash! Splash!

Water covered the ground, the trees, and even the mountains.

But Noah and his family were safe inside the ark because they obeyed God.

The ark floated on the water for many days. Inside the ark, Noah cared for the animals and trusted God to protect them.

Finally, the rain stopped. Slowly the waters began to go down.

Noah sent out a raven, then later a dove. One day, the dove returned carrying a fresh olive leaf in its beak.

“Noah,” the family shouted happily, “the waters are going down!”

After some time, the ground became dry. God told Noah and his family to come out of the ark.

The first thing Noah did was thank God.

Then God placed a beautiful rainbow in the sky.

The rainbow was God’s promise that He would never destroy the whole earth again with a flood.

### **Illustration**

A rainbow reminds us that God always keeps His promises. Just as a loving parent keeps promises to their child, God also keeps every promise He makes.

### **Lessons We Learn From Noah**

- Obey God even when others laugh at you.
- Trust God even when you cannot see what is coming.
- God protects those who follow Him.
- God always keeps His promises.
- Children can also walk with God faithfully.

### **Simple Life Application for Kids**

When parents, teachers, or God’s Word tell us to do what is right, we should obey quickly just like Noah did. Obedience brings blessings and protection.

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# **DAY 1: GOD SAW NOAH’S RIGHTEOUSNESS**

## **Bible Reading**

Genesis 6:5-10

## **Introduction**

People on earth became very wicked, but Noah loved and obeyed God. God was pleased with Noah because he walked with Him faithfully.

## **Lesson Points**

- God sees everything people do.
- Sin makes God sad.
- Noah chose to obey God.
- We should live differently from the world.

## **Memory Verse**

“Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time.” —  
Genesis 6:9

## **Activities**

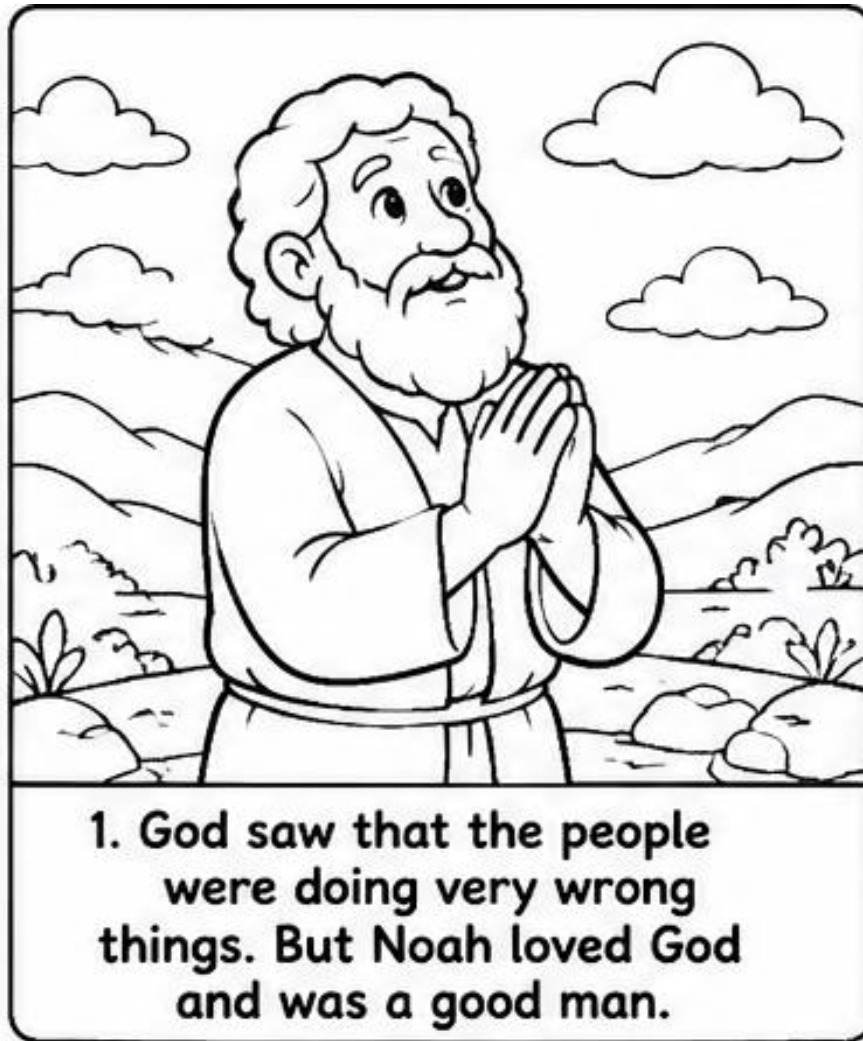
1. Draw Noah and his family.

## **DAY 2: GOD COMMANDS NOAH TO BUILD THE ARK**

### **Bible Reading**

Genesis 6:11-22

### **Introduction**

God gave Noah special instructions to build an ark. Noah obeyed even though building the ark was difficult.

### **Lesson Points**

- God gives instructions for our good.
- Noah obeyed without complaining.
- Faith means trusting God completely.

- God always provides a way of safety.

## **Memory Verse**

“Noah did everything just as God commanded him.” — Genesis 6:22

## **Activities**

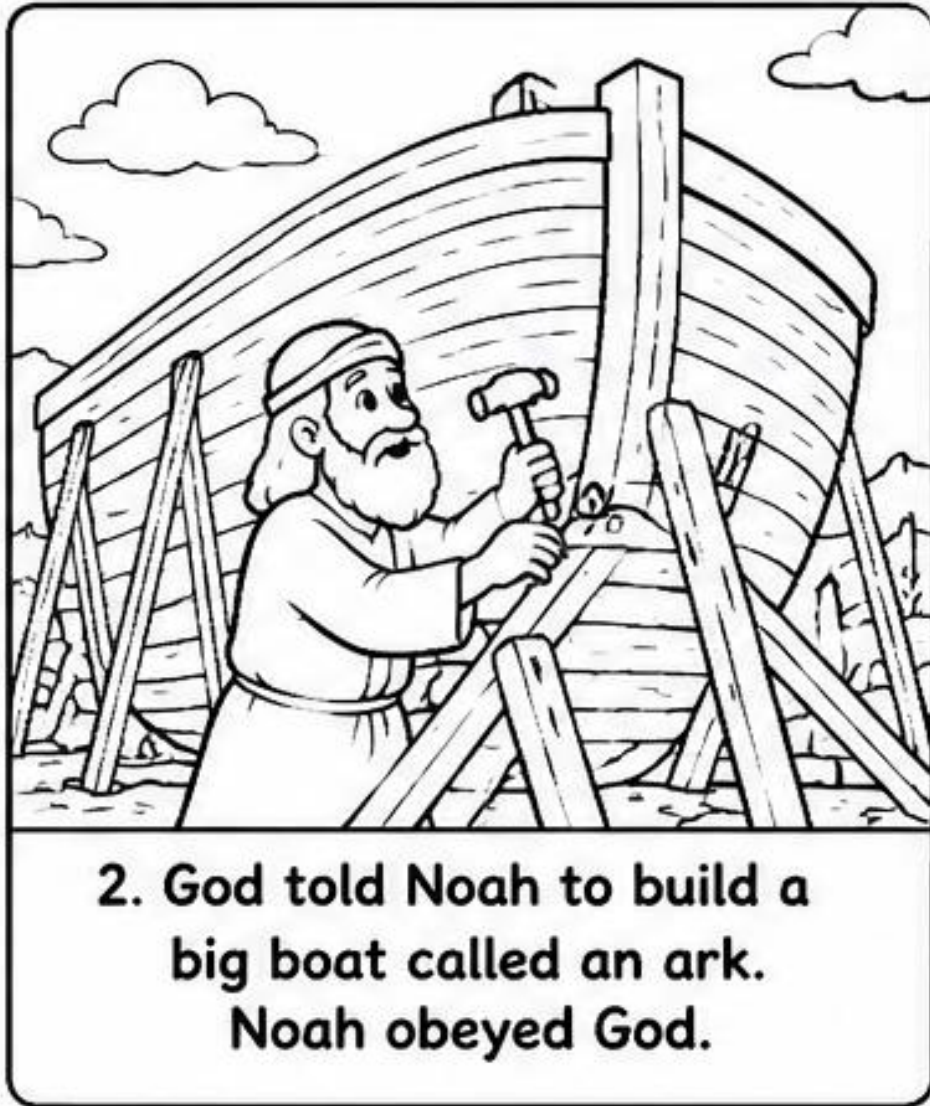
1. Make an ark using cardboard or paper.
2. Colour pictures of animals entering the ark.
3. Practice following instructions in class.

## **DAY 3: THE ANIMALS ENTERED THE ARK**

### **Bible Reading**

Genesis 7:1-10

### **Introduction**

God brought animals into the ark in pairs. Noah, his family, and the animals entered before the rain began.

### **Lesson Points**

- God cares for all creation.
- God keeps His promises.
- Noah trusted God before he saw the rain.
- God protects His children.

## **Memory Verse**

“The Lord shut him in.” — Genesis 7:16

## **Activities**

1. Name different animals in the Bible story.
2. Match animals in pairs.
3. Draw your favourite animal from the ark.

## **Discussion Questions**

1. How did the animals enter the ark?
2. Who closed the door of the ark?
3. How does God protect His people?

## **Prayer**

Father, thank You for protecting and caring for me every day. Amen.



**3. God told Noah to take his family and two of every kind of animal into the ark.**



**4. When everything was ready, God said, "Go into the ark." Then God closed the door.**

# **DAY 4: THE FLOOD CAME**

## **Bible Reading**

Genesis 7:11-24

## **Introduction**

Rain fell for forty days and forty nights. Water covered the earth, but Noah and his family were safe inside the ark.

## **Lesson Points**

- God's word always comes true.
- Sin brings judgment.
- God protects those who trust Him.
- We should always be ready to obey God.

## **Memory Verse**

“The rain fell on the earth forty days and forty nights.” — Genesis 7:12

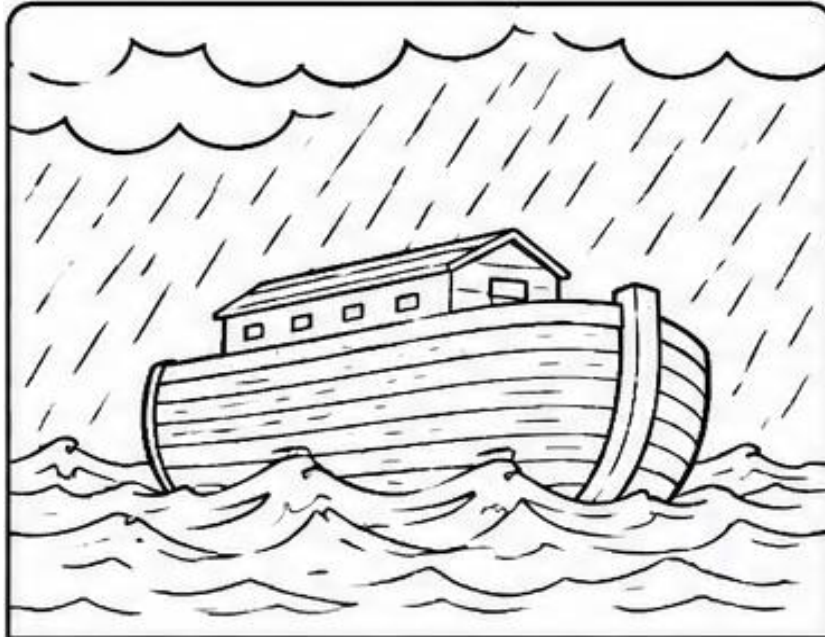
## **Activities**

1. Count to forty together.
2. Create rain sounds using hands.
3. Make a paper cloud craft.

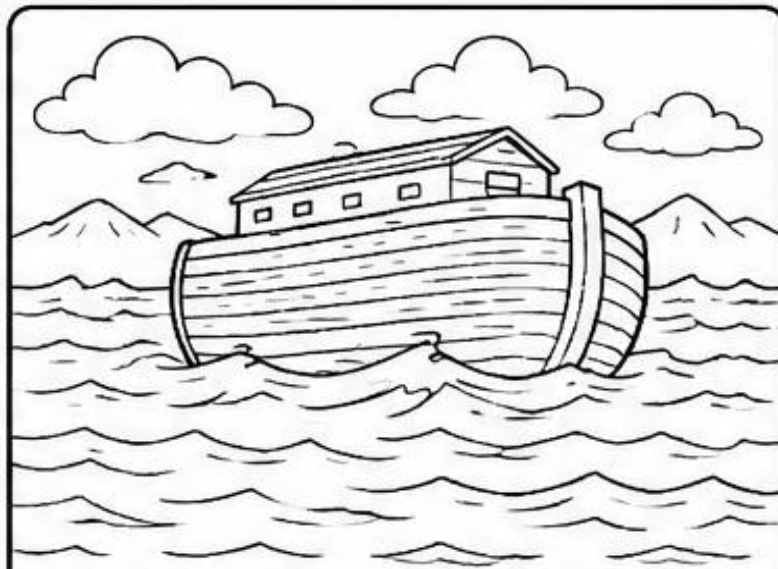
## **Discussion Questions**

## **Bible Reading**

Genesis 8:1-14

## **Introduction**

After many days, God caused the waters to go down. Noah sent out birds to check if the land was dry.

## **Lesson Points**

- God never forgets His children.
- Waiting requires patience.
- God answers at the right time.
- We must continue trusting God.

## **Memory Verse**

“But God remembered Noah.” — Genesis 8:1

## **Activities**

1. Draw a dove carrying an olive leaf.
2. Act out Noah sending birds.
3. Share a time when you waited patiently.

## **Discussion Questions**

1. Which birds did Noah send out?
2. What did the dove bring back?
3. Why is patience important?

## **Prayer**

Dear God, help me to wait patiently and trust Your timing. Amen.



## **DAY 6: GOD’S COVENANT AND THE RAINBOW**

### **Bible Reading**

Genesis 8:15-22; Genesis 9:8-17

### **Introduction**

When Noah left the ark, he thanked God. God placed a rainbow in the sky as a sign of His covenant.

### **Lesson Points**

- We should thank God for His blessings.
- God keeps His promises forever.
- The rainbow reminds us of God’s love.
- Worship pleases God.

### **Memory Verse**

“I have set my rainbow in the clouds.” — Genesis 9:13

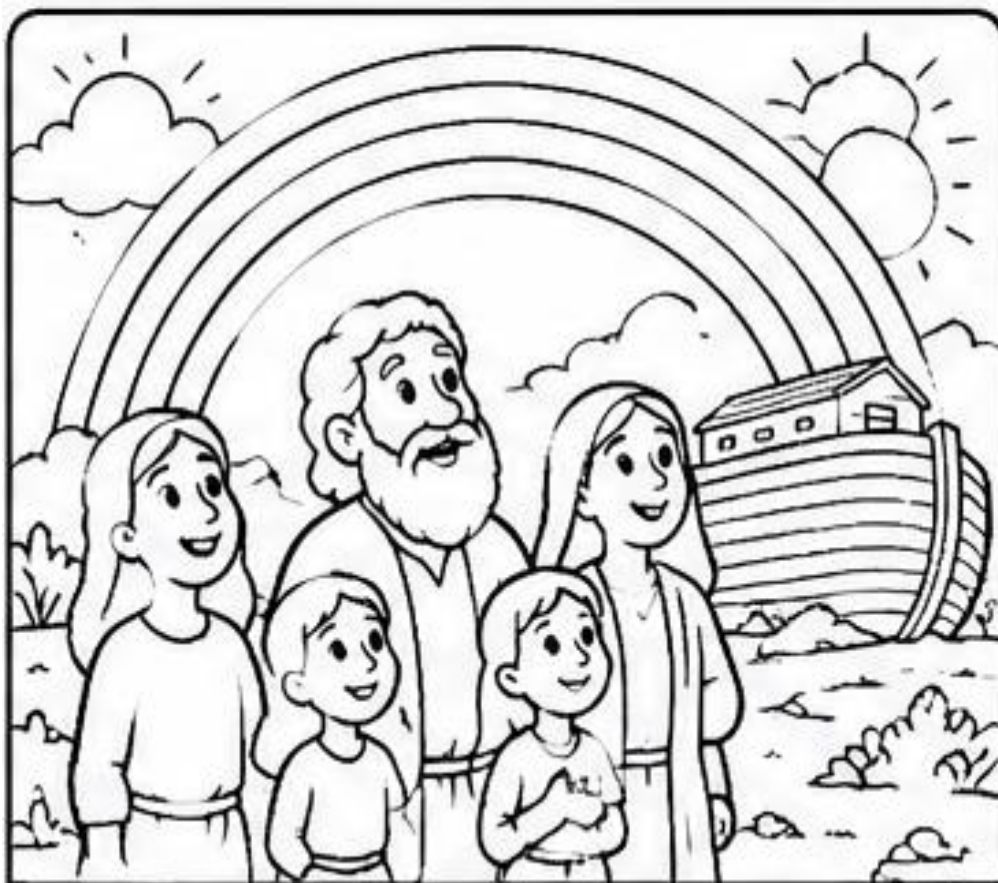
1. Colour a rainbow.
2. Learn rainbow colours.
3. Sing a thanksgiving song.

3. Build a small ark model as a group.
